LED (Light Emitting Diode) lights are energy efficient in that they use 80% less electricity and cost less than a dollar per season to operate (per 300 C7-sized bulbs), and have a long life span (20,000 hour average LED life). LED lights are safe and cool to the touch, no matter how long they have been on.

Families who take advantage of the Holiday Light Exchange will be happy when their SCE bill comes after the holidays, for each new strand of LED lights will save hundreds of kilowatt hours now and in the years to come, and that translates to saving money during the holidays!
